EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE & HUNGER RELIEF

Across our 11-county service area, Catholic Charities provides immediate, compassionate support to individuals and families facing crisis by ensuring access to food, housing, essential resources, and a pathway toward long-term stability.



342,216

1,924

neighbors received case management and emergency assistance to help stabilize their housing and support their family needs.



COUNSELING & FAMILY EMPOWERMENT

Catholic Charities offers a safe, supportive space for people to improve their well-being through family development services, parenting education, and mental health counseling.

Early Intervention That Changes a Child's Trajectory

Janie, a three-year-old facing severe behavioral challenges, was on the verge of preschool expulsion when our Early Childhood Mental Health consultant stepped in. Through observation and family engagement, the consultant identified the need to address her trauma. With the right supports in place and a referral to partners, the child's language, behavior, and emotional regulation improved dramatically. She is among the hundreds of children who are now thriving in their classrooms and no longer at risk of expulsion due to our interventions.



655 clients received life improving mental health care through **4,857** sessions.



2,297 children, parents, and care providers received early childhood mental health consultation and parenting education classes.



86% of our Parent Education participants experienced an increase in positive family functioning.

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SENIOR & CAREGIVER SUPPORT

Catholic Charities honors the dignity of older adults and supports those who care for them by offering compassionate guidance and respite to help families navigate aging with confidence and grace.

Despite a year of federal funding disruption, our AmeriCorps Seniors programs persevered. In the Fall of 2025, we expanded our reach by launching **Kindred Companions** in local parishes. Rooted in Catholic social teaching, *Kindred Companions* empowers volunteers to walk alongside older adults so they can age in place with dignity and connection.

A Steady Presence for Seniors in Need

Jackie, a dedicated Senior Companion volunteer in Clermont County, supports three older adults who rely on her weekly visits. She provides essential respite for two families caring for aging loved ones, and she is a lifeline for another neighbor who has no family or transportation to medical appointments. Her presence brings comfort, stability, and connection to each person she serves. She and other Senior Companions ensured that 96% of our homebound clients in need were able to live more independently.



MIGRANT & REFUGEE SERVICES

Catholic Charities welcomes families rebuilding their lives to achieve safety, self-sufficiency and hope.

Despite a difficult year in 2025, our Migrant & Refugee Services programs intensified their response to our migrant and refugee brothers and sisters, so they could persevere through hardship, continue building their lives, and strengthen our communities.
