Su Casa Hispanic Center

Health Promotions Support – Assist with data entry, filing, preparing for health screening events and assembling hygiene kits.

Produce Distribution – Help assemble bags of produce for distribution.

Packaging Hygiene Kits – Assemble hygiene kits at the Lockland warehouse and then assist with unloading at Catholic Charities. *A great opportunity for families and groups to serve together.*



Refugee Resettlement

Mentors – Support high school youth or young adults in achieving their educational and vocational goals while promoting civil and social engagement. Must be 21 years old.

Produce Pick Up– Use your own vehicle to pick up produce from our St. Joseph Pantry on the 2nd Tuesday of each month and deliver to Catholic Charities for distribution and delivery to refugee families. *Ideal for organized groups who share a flexible monthly rotation, making it easy to serve together and help families access healthy food.*



Migrant Services

Appointment and Pantry Drivers – Provide transportation to refugee families for medical and social service appointments, or to a local food pantry. Must be 21 years old.

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Food for All – Food Pantry

Help distribute food to struggling families in Adams, Butler, Brown, Clermont, Clinton, Hamilton, and Highland counties. Pantries take place weekdays, 9:00am - 1:30pm at the same locations on the same day each month.

Bilingual (Spanish/English) speakers welcome.



Education

Classroom Assistants – Facilitate small group activities and address individual student needs with guidance from Lead Teacher.

Hospitality for English Learners - Serve soup, crackers, desserts, etc. to ESOL students during in-person classes (food and supplies provided). ***BONUS – ServSafe certification available.***

Caregiver Assistance Network

Support Group Facilitator – Lead support groups and other programs for those caring for loved ones.

Peer Mentor - Support caregivers by sharing your “been there” experience, skills, and knowledge.

Co-Lead Powerful Tools for Caregivers classes - Facilitate classes to help caregivers take better care of themselves while caring for a friend or relative. ***Training is provided.***



Group/Remote Opportunities

Build Family Care Kits from Home - Help those in need by purchasing needed items and assembling them into kits. List of needed items available upon request.

Support Immigration Detainees – Assist with maintaining the detainee database and/or write encouraging postcards to detainees in the Butler County Jail.

Make T-shirt Totes from Home – Repurpose t-shirts and turn them into totes for food distribution at the mobile pantries.

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
